Personal Study: Shine

Main Text: Ephesians 5:8–9

Introduction: From Darkness to Light

- We once walked in spiritual darkness; in Christ, we are now light.
- Light is not just something we receive, but we are light in the Lord.

Additional Scriptures:

- 1 Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light."
- John 8:12 "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness but have the light of life."

Reflection:

Think about your life before knowing Christ. How were your days, decisions, and relationships?

Questions for Meditation:

- 1. Can I recognize moments when I lived in "darkness"?
- 2. How has Christ transformed me since then?

1. Remember Our Past

"For you were once darkness..." (Ephesians 5:8a)

Complementary Scripture:

• Romans 13:12 – "The night is far spent; the day is at hand. Therefore, let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light."

Reflection:

Identify areas of your life where you may still act as if you were in darkness.

Questions:

- 1. What habits or attitudes should I leave behind?
- 2. How can I thank God for bringing me out of darkness?

2. Affirm Our Present Identity

"...but now you are light in the Lord." (v.8b)

Complementary Scripture:

• Matthew 5:14–16 – "You are the light of the world... Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

Reflection:

Your identity does not depend on what you do, but on who you are in Christ.

Questions:

- 1. Am I aware that I am light in the Lord?
- 2. How can I reflect that light at home, work, and in my community?

3. Walk According to the Light

"Walk as children of light." (v.8c)

Complementary Scripture:

• Colossians 1:10 – "...that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God."

Reflection:

Walking in the light means consistency, integrity, and living with coherence every day.

Questions:

- 1. In which areas of my life do I need to reflect Christ's light more?
- 2. What changes can I make this week to live more as a child of light?

4. The Fruit of the Light

"...for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth." (v.9)

Complementary Scripture:

• Galatians 5:22–23 – "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control."

Reflection:

The fruit of light is seen in our goodness, righteousness, and truth. It's not just about rules, but a transformed heart.

Questions:

- 1. What fruit of the light can I cultivate this week?
- 2. How can I impact others with the light God has placed in me?

Conclusion and Application

- God has called us from darkness into the light.
- We are children of light and must walk as such.
- Our testimony illuminates others so they may glorify the Father.

Final Reflection Questions:

- 1. Am I reflecting Christ's light in my daily life?
- 2. What can I do this week to "shine" brighter for Him?
